If you need something like "csv" use GitHub's search. TORONTO -- A Toronto man charged with sexually assaulting two young girls more than a decade ago has been sentenced to three years in prison. Ontario Superior Court Justice Lucille Ridgeway heard victim impact statements from one of the girls, which described their trauma and suffering at the hands of Sheldon Munroe. She said Tuesday that both girls were "dismayed" that Munroe had used his power to keep the victims quiet. "You didn't care about these girls' lives, their educational futures, their ability to live a normal life and they were left with no closure," Ridgeway told Munroe. In 2007, the girls accused Munroe of molesting them in the early 2000s. He admitted to the offences, saying he had no memory of them, and was convicted in 2009 of sexual interference, sexual exploitation and administering a noxious thing. At a subsequent sentencing hearing, he said he had suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder since the incidents. The girls, who have been in therapy since their childhood, say that Munroe's crimes have had a long-lasting impact. "I thought he was someone special," the older girl said. "He had everything." The younger girl said the first thing she thought of when she remembered the abuse was "f---ing Sheldon," because she had been told to apologize to him. Munroe appeared in court wearing a green-and-white inmate jumpsuit with a prisoner number. He shook hands with the girls and addressed them by their first names. Ridgeway said she accepted the arguments made by defence lawyer Marcia Sheard that Munroe's offences were "minor" and he had been "incarcerated" for more than a decade. Munroe, who had submitted a written apology and testified in court, could be released on day parole when he serves his sentence. Sheard said Munroe is eligible for "early release" because he is 70 years old and had a severe medical condition. She said his condition is stable and he is doing well at the medium-security Blair Institution in Napanee, Ont. But Ridgeway said she accepted testimony from a psychiatrist who said Munroe 82157476af
